Format

The event is **Sealed**: each player receives a deck "opened" on the spot. The cost of the deck for the event is **€18**. NB: Deck swaps between players are only allowed **before the start** of the rounds, without the use of coercion or blackmail.

Everyone is encouraged to handle decks and cards with **the utmost respect**: they are to be considered part of the prerelease until the event is over. At the end of the 3 rounds, each player takes home **the deck they played with**.

Structure

Each domain (or group of domains) plays **3 rounds** on one or more dates within the Week of Sabbat, from **Saturday 18** to **Sunday 26 October**.

Each round is played at **4-player tables**:

There will be exactly **1 deck per Path** at each table. The draw of players and seating is always **random** (see appendix for recommended practical procedures).

At the end of each round, ranking points are calculated based on:

- GW (Game Win) 3 POINTS per GW obtained
- VP (Victory Points) 1 POINT per VP obtained

There will be no final: after the 3 rounds, the total sum of ranking points is communicated to the event coordinators.

THE FOLLOWING MUST BE REPORTED: PLAYER NAMES, PATHS PLAYED, GW AND VP SCORED

Appendix

Practical Round Management

Table Generation

Prepare player cards/markers with names, and draw them to form groups of 4, which will make up the various tables.

After the first round, to reduce the chance of repeated prey-predator pairings, it is recommended to move the decks of 2 different Paths to another table (before drawing the seating) — e.g., Path of Cathari and Caine.

After the second round, move the decks of the other 2 Paths that did not change tables in the previous round (before drawing the seating).

Deck Draw

Prepare 4 deck cards (one per Path) and draw them for each table (first round only). Each player at the table will have a different Path.

Seating Draw

Draw the 4 seat cards as usual to determine each player's position at the table.
